- I. Troop Meetings: The regular meeting day is Monday @ 7:00pm in St. Timothy's Episcopal Church. All faiths are welcome, Troop 1667 is a non-denominational troop. The last Monday of the month is a Patrol Leader Council meeting led by Scouts for planning the next month's troop meetings and events along with a 3-2-1 month look ahead.
 - Court of Honor is an awards ceremony held three times per year to honor our Scouts for the awards and rank advancements they have earned, also Scout led. All parents, grandparents and siblings are encouraged to attend.
- II. Troop Equipment and Supplies: When a Scout joins the troop she receives a troop neckerchief and t-shirt both designed by the Scouts, and a troop numeral patch "1667" with paid dues.
 - Troop 1667 and 667 are sharing troop equipment such as camp stoves, patrol boxes, lanterns, and coolers from the storage unit at St. Tim's. Eventually Troop 1667 is working on more equipment through fundraisers and Popcorn sales. As the troop grows and earns money perhaps a troop trailer might be in order.
 - Each Scout family should provide a full uniform, personal gear, mess kit, toiletries, sleeping bag, backpack or duffle bag, camping essentials, a tent to share and a Scout handbook
- III. Registration Fees, Troop Dues, Finance and Fundraising: The troop plans various fundraising events year round where scouts can earn money for the troop. Scouts are responsible for \$76.00 dues for the year, when joining, then annually. The dues help pay for awards, patches, and other Scout related items. Popcorn sales is a big fundraiser for the Troop, held in August through October every year by Scouts BSA. Scouts are also responsible for their share of camping costs. National Registration fees are \$85 for Scouts and \$48 for Adult Leaders, pro-rated monthly.
